ENVIRONMENTAL SUPPORT

At Sembawang Shipyard, we believe in taking a pro-active role in educating our younger generation on the importance of environmental care and protection. The Green Wave Environmental Care Competition was launched in January 2003 and is an annual competition opened to all students at Primary, Secondary, Junior Colleges and Institute of Technical Education (ITE) and Tertiary Institutions. This competition seeks to motivate students to experiment with ideas and technologies to develop new ways to protect the environment. It challenges students to identify real life problems, work in teams and think out-of-the-box to come up with innovative solutions to current real world problems. Winners of this competition receive their awards at ceremonies organized yearly which are well attended by all the relevant authorities/ organizations in environment care and protection.

The 7th Annual Green Wave Environmental Care Project for Schools 2009 award presentation ceremony was successfully held on 29th January 2010 at Marina Mandarin Hotel, Singapore. We received a total of 292 project entries and participation from more than 1,000 student participants from Primary, Secondary, JC/ITE and Tertiary Levels, setting another new record level of participation since 2003.
