Sembawang Shipyard Launches “Green Wave” Environmental Care Project For Schools

Singapore, January 6, 2003 - Sembawang Shipyard Private Limited, a subsidiary of SembCorp Marine Ltd, is pleased to announce the launch of the “Green Wave” Environmental Care Project for schools in Singapore.

Sembawang Shipyard’s “Green Wave” Environmental Care Project, which starts from January 2, 2003 to August 31, 2003, is open to all students of the different school levels i.e. Primary, Secondary, Junior Colleges / Centralised Institutes / Institute of Technical Education (ITE) and Tertiary Institutions. This competition will be offered to the schools on a yearly basis commencing from 2003. The main objective of the “Green Wave” Environmental Care Project is to inculcate in students a sense of personal and group responsibility for their own environment and in the process, develop creative and innovative ideas in the area of environment care and protection such that individually and together, we can contribute towards the conservation and improvement of our environment for Singapore’s sustainable development.

“In targeting at students, we aspire to persuade and influence young minds to think globally and act locally for environmental protection and improvement. We sincerely hope that this project will promote innovative thinking among students and encourage them to develop new ideas, processes and equipment for the betterment of our environment. More importantly, we hope that our “Green Wave” Environmental Care Project would set students on a life-long

interest and concern for the environment, thus contributing to the development of a better future for theirs and subsequent generations. We are grateful to the Ministry of Education for their guidance, pro-activeness and assistance in facilitating this meaningful project and we are confident that our “Green Wave” initiative will challenge our student population to come up with innovative and interesting ideas on how we can preserve our environment”, said Ms Wong Lee Lin, General Manager of Sembawang Shipyard Pte Ltd and Chairperson of the shipyard’s Community & Environment Care Group, specially set up in May 2002 to provide a spectrum of community services to specific targeted groups.

All student participants, whether taking part individually or as a team, would have six months to work on their proposed project between February 2003 to August 31, 2003. All projects submitted would be evaluated and judged by a panel of distinguished experts based on several key factors such as originality and innovation, relevance, impact / sustainability, project product, the project’s ability to reach its goals, the long-term environmental benefits of the project and the positive environment impact on the community. Results of the competition will be announced by November 30, 2003 through a circular to be sent to the participating schools/tertiary institutions. The results will also be posted on Sembawang Shipyard’s official website. Winning teams can expect the following attractive cash awards:

The prize money for the Primary, Secondary and Junior Colleges/Centralised Institutes and ITEs would be shared on a 60%-40% basis with the 60% going to the School fund and the 40% to the student/students who are in the project team.
