On 28 April 2010, Sembawang Shipyard successfully held a naming ceremony for the dynamic positioning fallpipe vessel Flintstone from Dredging Environmental and Marine Engineering Group (DEME) and its subsidiary, Tideway.

The naming ceremony was graced by Guest-of-Honour, Lady Sponsor Mrs Nora Kassam, wife of Mr Oliver Kassam, General Manager of Acergy Australia and attended by VIP guests and senior Directors/Managers from DEME, Tideway and Sembawang Shipyard.

Speaking at the naming ceremony, Mr PK Ong, Managing Director said, "This project presented many challenges and I am pleased to say that our team has risen to the occasion and recorded noteworthy milestones including vessel's strike steel on 8 January 2009, lay keel on 16 April 2009 and of course, the important naming ceremony. Our HSE achievement is also commendable with 2.64 million manhours Lost Time Accident Free recorded. There are still critical phases

of the project that the team must focus on after the naming of the ship this morning, including specialized steel structure construction on the main deck, integration of owner's furnished equipment and mechanical completion. Let's ensure that we continue to do our best for the vessel and work towards the timely delivery of this vessel to owners, in the high quality standard that is synonymous with our shipyard."

Upon completion, this new generation of environmentally friendly designed fallpipe rock dumping vessel will be equipped with DP 2 capability to carry out precise rock placement works at a depth of no less than 2,000 metres. She will be DEME/Tideway's largest fallpipe vessel and will be deployed worldwide.
